She was born on June 4, 1953, in Annapolis, Maryland to the late James Eugene Young and Lillian Young Brown. In addition to her parents, she was preceded in death by one brother, Juan R. Woods.

Bee Bee was baptized at the First Baptist Church of Annapolis, Maryland and was a faithful and loyal member. She proudly embraced the importance of maintaining the church history. In addition to serving at the First Baptist Church of Annapolis, Bee Bee served with her husband in his Deacon's Ministry at the Nazareth Baptist Church in Boston, Virginia.

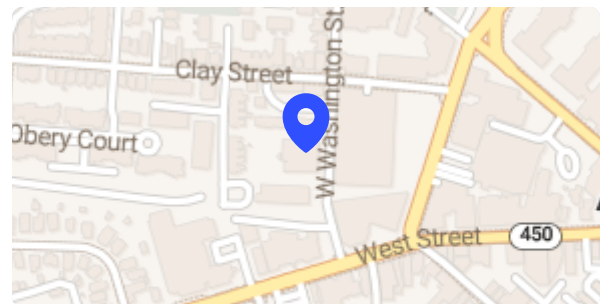

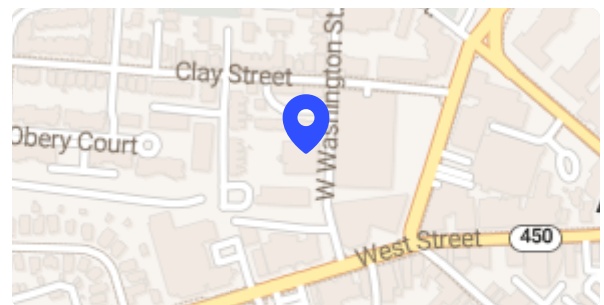
