Lawrence Edward Dickson, 64 of Riva, Maryland departed this life on May 2, 2019. Born in Johnstown, PA, March 22, 1955 he resided in Conemaugh, PA until settling into New Carrollton, MD while in elementary school. There he grew up among many like young families making many acquaintances and lifelong friendships. He participated in many sports but developed a passion for football in which he excelled. His football prowess grew through Boys Club where he led many teams to multiple PG County Championships as quarterback. At Parkdale High School he transitioned from JV to Varsity and led the Panthers to 2 County Championships and the #1 ranking in Washington, DC Metropolitan VA and MD area.

Following high school he had many scholarships offered but chose to attend the University of Maryland where he started out playing freshman ball as a quarterback and moved quickly to varsity where he had achieved many individual and team accomplishments. 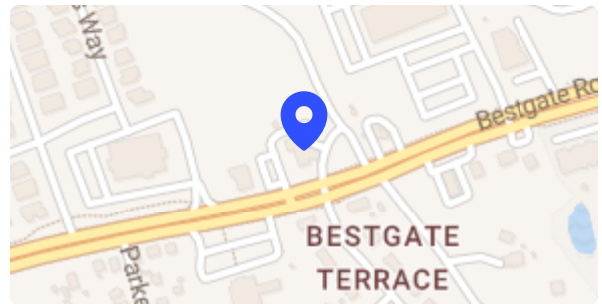

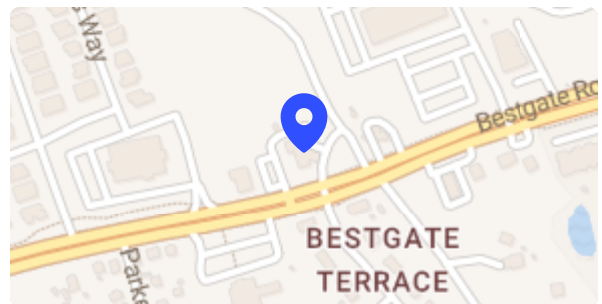
