**J**oan M Jaseph, 89, of Annapolis, died April 2nd after a short illness. She was born in Huntington, WV on June 27, 1931 to George Jeffers and Marie Waugh. She attended Eastern H.S. in Wash. D.C. and later worked on Capitol Hill for several Congressional Representatives and National Committees. She retired at 65 and moved to Pinehurst, NC for a decade and enjoyed retirement with friends. Joan enjoyed golf, was competitive, and an accomplished golfer until almost 80 years of age.

Her marriage of 23 yrs. to Harold Jaseph ended in divorce. Her younger brother Jon, preceded her in death. She is survived by three children, William of Alexandria, VA; Robin of Kensington, MD; and James (Leslie) of Crownsville, MD and four grandchildren, Joni Aarden (Gijs), Philip Jaseph, Robert Jaseph, and Julia Jaseph, and four great-grand children.

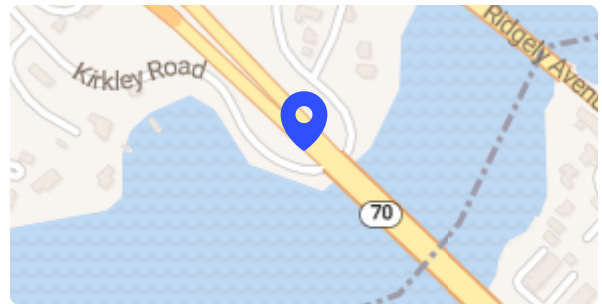

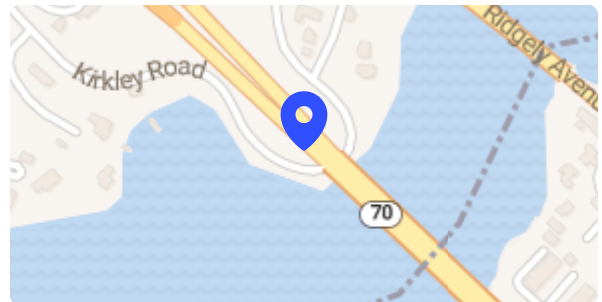

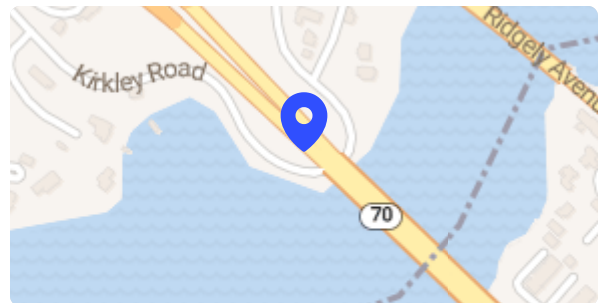
