Patrick A. McKinnon, 79, of Annapolis, Maryland passed away on Thursday, March 3, 2022 at Anne Arundel Medical Center.

Patrick was born to Vincent and Evelyn McKinnon and was the youngest of four sons. Patrick received his BSEE from The Catholic University in 1983 and his Master's degree in Technology Management from the University of Maryland in 1995. He joined The National Security Agency in 1964 and was proud to have spent 29 years as an engineer and computer specialist.
