But he remained a copilot for years because it meant he could hold a line that allowed him to spend more time with the family. He gave up flying fighters in the Guard and local politics when Mom told him his children needed him. He was successful and he made a lot of money but he spent that money on his family and gave generously back to God.

His generation were stoic providers who rarely expressed verbal or physical affection for their wife or children. But Papa was a rare exception. He always hugged us and told us how much he loved us, that he was proud of us. He made us believe that we could make our dreams come true if we trusted Jesus and worked hard.

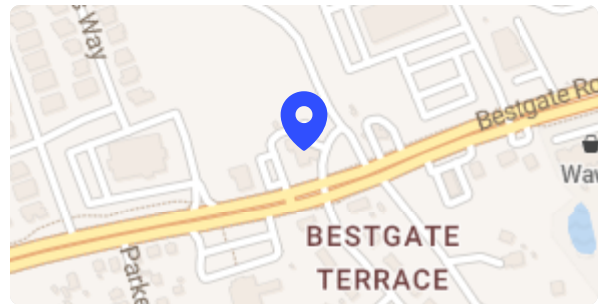

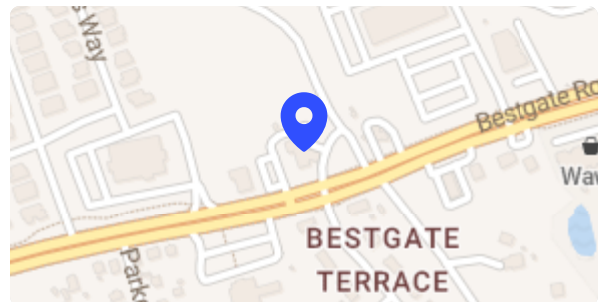
