Robert Lee Langley Sr., affectionately known as “Bob,” passed away peacefully on April 2, 2026, following a long illness.

Bob was born on December 27, 1946, in Bardstown, Kentucky, to John and Evelyn Langley. After graduating from Bloomfield High School in 1964, he proudly served his country in the United States Air Force. During his service, he was stationed in Vietnam as a jet engine technician until his honorable discharge in 1968.

Following his military service, Bob built a successful career in the real estate industry. He traveled extensively across the country, working as a manager for Pulte Homes in locations ranging from Washington State to Georgia. Eventually, his journey brought him to the Maryland/Washington, D.C. area, where he met Beverly, a real estate agent who would become his wife in 1986. 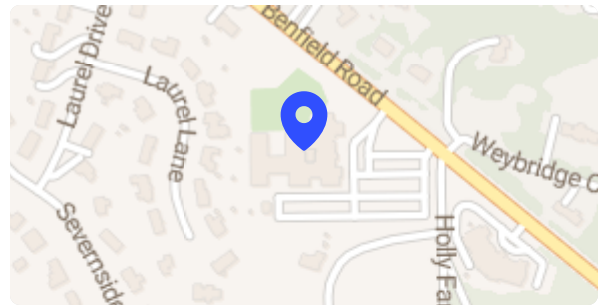
